- Has a strong understanding of the regulations, standards, policies and guidelines that affect TCM practice in Ontario?

Professional Practice Advisor Role

This is a part-time, hourly position where you will work remotely out of a home office. The role requires flexibility as work hours are determined, depending on the volume of inquiries received. You will be part of a dedicated team committed to protecting the public interest and supporting TCM practitioners and acupuncturists' professional development. This position is a first for the College, and you will have a unique opportunity to shape this role.

As a Professional Practice Advisor, you will:

- Be the first point of contact for practitioners who need practice advice, or for members of the public and other stakeholders who have questions about the practice of TCM and acupuncture;
- Provide advice to College staff and Committees about the practice of the profession and application of the College's standards practice;
- Stay informed of changes in the practice environment and other relevant issues that affect the provision of TCM and acupuncture services;
- Support the development of standards of practice and guidelines that establish the expectations for professional practice and ultimately protect the public.

Qualifications and Experience

We are looking for a member of the profession who:

- Is registered in good standing with a General Certificate of Registration;
- Has at least five years of clinical practice experience as a Registered Traditional Chinese Medicine Practitioner and/or Acupuncturist;
- Has strong communication skills (e.g., writing and presentation skills);
- Is self-directed and able to work independently;
- Has sound judgement and ability to problem solve;
- Is able to deal with confidential issues in a sensitive and professional manner; and
- Has a solid understanding and commitment to CTCMPAO mandate and values.
