3. Minimum of three years of full-time TCM clinical practice as a TCM Practitioner AND a minimum of 2,400 patient visits.			
4. Candidates with a minimum of ten years of full-time TCM practice as a TCM Practitioner AND a minimum of 8,000 patient visits, are exempted from the written cognitive examination.			
<b>Optional:</b> In preparation, a candidate may complete part or all of an Academic Bridging Program approved by CTCMPAO, and offered by a government-approved academic institution.			
Doctor Class Registration Examination 1. Written registration examination: Comprised of 80 – 100 questions on competencies unique to Dr.TCM Class; maximum 2.5 hours.

2. Clinical registration examination: Comprised of two clinical simulations/cases (OSCE/CCS): maximum 2 hours.

## **Doctor Class Registration Examination**

1. Cognitive registration written examination using multiple choice questions. (5 - 6 hours with 225 - 255)questions) on the complete set of competencies, including 80 – 100 questions unique to Doctor Class competencies, in two sitting, with a minimum two-hour break. Maximum 3 hours/sitting. May be conducted over two days.

## AND

2. Clinical/psychomotor registration examination using objective structured clinical examination (OSCE) and/or clinical case study (CCS). (4–5 hours with four clinical simulations / cases)
