Any Health Care Worker who cannot work from home now eligible for COVID-19 vaccine

Who is eligible?

Any remaining health care workers who cannot work from home, and who live or work in Halton will be eligible to book an appointment for vaccination at a community clinic as of **Friday, April 16, 2021**.

Health Care Workers include custodial, security, reception and other staff. As of April 16, eligible health care workers can book their COVID-19 vaccine appointment online at halton.ca/COVIDvaccines.

To be eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, health care workers must:

- **work or live in Halton Region AND**
- **not work from home.**

If you are working remotely full-time, please do not book an appointment at this time. As vaccine supply increases, eligibility will be expanded.

Please note that health care workers defined as Highest Priority, Very High Priority and High Priority (providing direct, in-person care at least once a week) in the [Guidance for Prioritizing Health Care Workers for COVID-19 Vaccination](#) remain eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine and may book an appointment.

How to book an appointment

- You will be asked to attest to your eligibility as a health care worker.

Please bring to your appointment:

- Ontario Health card
- Proof of employment (e.g., workplace ID/badge, paystub, professional I.D. number, etc.)
